FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God's Sumptuous, Free Banquet

Dear People of God,

This Sunday's readings talk about the "Hunger for Heaven". Isaiah describes a banquet of "juicy, rich food and pure choice wine. He says, "God will provide it for all the People. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of a king, referring to God, who prepares a wedding feast for his son. This is the same feast which John describes at the conclusion of his book of Revelation (19:7). Jesus compares the kingdom of God both here on earth and in heaven to the wedding banquet. God is life itself; therefore, God is the food, the drink, the table, and the home. As he celebrates himself in creation, so does he again, at his redemptive works for his people.

Why do we have dinner and banquet? It is not just for filling our stomach and to quench our thirst. Rather, it is for being together, sharing, caring, loving, and feeling more joyful. What does usually a young man do to young girl when he decides to marry her? He asks her, "Are you free this evening to go with me for a dinner?" And the young lady who accepts his invitation is not thinking of filling her stomach. Rather she accepts it as an occasion for her to get to know the man and get acquainted with him. It is simply for both of them a time of exchange of understanding and feeling joyful being together. The taste of food, the dietary quality of it, or even the environment of the restaurant is secondary.

This is what it means when the Bible talks about God preparing a banquet or feast for God's people. As we feel a sense of liberation from all our inhibitions at a party and we feel content and filled at a delicious dinner, so we feel God's redemption. People who are fed by God this way are content and joyful like Paul in the second reading. He says, "I can do all things in God who strengthens me." God's party is a banquet of joy and forgiveness because God would destroy death forever and would wipe away the tears from every face. It is a banquet of rest and peace. It is a life-giving banquet to make us courageous, powerful, wise content, tolerant, patient and fully humane. God bless us all Fr. Lawrence





Parish Nurse's Notes

Proper Handwashing

With the cold and flu season fast approaching, a simple way to protect yourself, and your family is with proper handwashing.

How do Germs Spread? Germs can spread from person to person or from surfaces to people when you: Touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands, prepare or eat food, and drinks with unwashed hands, touch surfaces or objects that have germs on them, blow your nose, cough, or sneeze into hands and then touch other people's hands or common objects. Washing hands can keep you healthy and prevent the spread of respiratory and diarrheal infections.

Times to Wash Hands ~ You can help yourself and your loved ones stay healthy by washing your hands often, especially during these key times when you are likely to get and spread germs: Before, during, and after preparing food, Before and after eating food, Before and after caring for someone at home who is sick with vomiting or diarrhea, Before and after treating a cut or wound, After using the toilet, After changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet, After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing, After touching an animal, animal feed, or animal waste, After handling pet food or pet treats & After touching garbage.

Follow Five Steps to Wash Your Hands the Right Way

Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap. Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails. Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice. Rinse your hands well under clean, running water. Dry your hands using a clean towel or an air dryer.

Use Hand Sanitizer When You Can't Use Soap and Water ~

If soap and water are not readily available, you can use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Apply the gel product to the palm of one hand. Cover all surfaces of hands.

Rub your hands and fingers together until they are dry. This should take around 20 seconds.



UPDATE ON BEST CHOICE LABELS FOR MISSION II

HAITI: Thank you to everyone who collected, trimmed and counted the Best Choice Bar Code Labels for Mission II Haiti. This year so far 44,000 labels were redeemed at 3 cents a bar code. A total of \$1320 plus the bonus of \$30 and cash gifts of \$34 was forwarded to Mission II Haiti to dig and repair water wells. The work is done in the northeast section of the country, away from all of the civil unrest going on now. This project began in 2007 as a project of the Grand Island Diocesan Council of Catholic Women. So far \$33,000 has been forwarded to Mission II Haiti for their work to bring clean water wells to the people of Haiti.
