FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Stewards of Our Lives

This Sunday, through the parable of the 'Talents' Jesus teaches us a great lesson. We are reminded that one day we too will have to give an account of life, we received from God. God's grace and gifts

can neither be wasted, nor can they remain static, nor be hidden. They have to be put to use for the purpose they have been given and should bear fruits. What is evaluated at the coming of the master is not 'how much' we have made but how committed we are to the gifts, given to us.

In the parable, the first and the second servants doubled the amount they received. No doubt, these two servants had to exercise considerable shrewdness and astuteness in investing their talents. The third servant, showing no interest, took an easy path and hid the resources given to him. He was found lazy and unproductive and was fired from his job.

For us this parable communicates the message that each one of us is given a share in the mission of Christ. I never thought about coming to "Families in Faith" community and serve you as pastor. I agreed to this call, having discerned that my Time and Talent was meant to be given as a priest, as long as my health permits, serving the Church and the people of God. It was a decision about Stewardship, which in simple terms, is the act of putting God's priorities before our own.

Good Stewards do four things: 1. Receive God's gifts gratefully, 2. Nurture God's gifts responsibly, 3. Share God's gifts justly and charitably and 4. Return those gifts to God abundantly. Dear parishioners, all of us who make up the community of "Families in Faith", we are all called to live as good stewards, to put God's priorities before our own. We are called to receive, nurture, share, and return the gifts which God gives so abundantly. It is a way of living in the world. It is a spiritual stance in the midst of our incredibly busy lives. Our failure to live up to the call and produce fruits for the kingdom will make us lose the everlasting life. Though the master does not specify how much we should produce, he does not compromise on anything less than the best from us. Let us try our best in building up the kingdom of God. FOUR PILLARS OF STEWARDSHIP: HOSPITALITY, PRAYER, FORMATION, AND SERVICE

The first pillar is Hospitality.

Mary Ann McQuillan of Sacred Heart Parish has shared an excerpt from 'Stewardship Starts at Home'.
Using God's gifts to grow as disciples of Christ in our domestic church.

Lisa McArdle is an author and co-founder of Catholic Stewardship Consultants. In her book, *Stewardship Starts at Home*, she talks about the many ways we can practice stewardship, i.e., hospitality at home. Many of her suggestions harken back to the "good old days" when family life was simpler and spending time together was as common as watching Lawrence Welk on Saturday nights. With so many places to go and so many things to do, we are often "bumping into ourselves" and blaming others for our bruises. To make our home lives more peaceable, McArdle suggests the following:

- Employing a *Hospitality at Home Attitude:* This includes things as simple as sitting down to a meal together and talking about each other's day.
- Focusing on People (Not Screens): While this is pretty sensical, it's not so easy to do. The truth is time is fleeting; we will never get back the hours we waste staring at our cell phones and iPads instead of taking part in the lives around us.
- Special Meals: In a nutshell, McArdle says we should keep special days like holidays, birthdays, and even Sunday dinners as blessed opportunities to gather and "recharge" with members of our family.
- Building Up Inside the Walls: McArdle cautions families to avoid trying to outdo one another and instead to
 work on building each other up. As we all know, there are enough things in our everyday lives to wear and
 tear us down.
- Mind Your Manners: Remembering to practice simple mannerisms such as "please" and "thank you" can
 foster an air of goodness in the house, McArdle notes. It also helps establish kindness in our actions toward
 others outside the home. Even more important, she points out, is finding the humility to know when to say,
 "I'm sorry."
- Hospitality Towards Guests in the House: If you're lucky enough to have company come visit, treat them as
 you would family. Welcome them and treasure their visit so that when they leave, they feel valued and
 appreciated.
- Hospitality when Out and About: Finally, McArdle says to practice these same kindnesses when you leave your home and go out in public.

At a time when there's so much dissention and disagreement all around us, let's all do our best to be our best. As McArdle says, in the "give and take of hospitality... we have the opportunity to grow and become more and more like Jesus."
