FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Martha's Syndrome

Dear people of God,

Eugene O'Kelly was the chairman and chief executive of KPMG, one of America's big four accounting firms. In May 2005 he was diagnosed with late-stage brain cancer and had only three months to live. He writes of those final few months of life in a book he wrote, entitled "Chasing Daylight". In his own words: "My calendar was perpetually extended out over the next 18 months. I was always moving at 100 miles an hour. I worked all the time. I worked weekends. "I worked late into many nights. I missed virtually every school function for my younger daughter. My annual travel schedule averaged, conservatively, 150,000 miles. "For the first 10 years of my marriage, when I was climbing the ladder at KPMG, Corinne and I rarely went on vacation. After that, vacations were mostly rolled into the corporate outings I was required to attend." After his diagnosis he finally slowed down, and then, he writes, "I discovered depths to which a business person rarely goes, and learned how worthwhile it was to visit there, and sooner rather than later." Eugene O'Kelly had the Martha syndrome - absorbed by a relentless and all-consuming work schedule.

Today's Gospel is not a story about the priority of hearing the word over that of serving. This is a story about the difference between hearing and agitated toil. In other words, it's not what Martha is doing that is the problem; it's the way that she's doing it. Jesus replies, "Martha, Martha, you worry and fret about so many things..." Jesus addresses Martha because he is concerned that she is worried and fatigued. Jesus uses the example of Martha to speak to us, to say that when we are filled with anxiety and depleted, it is important to listen to the people who love us and to hear the voice of God in our lives. This is why Jesus says that listening is the better part. Not that it is more important than working or doing. But because it is only through listening that the work we do will give us life.
